Uwe Jacobs, Ph.D. is the clinical director for Survivors International, a non-profit treatment center dedicated to providing essential psychological and medical services to survivors of torture in the San Francisco Bay Area. For the past 15 years, he has worked with hundreds of survivors, and has developed and implemented a variety of treatment programs. He is an expert on both psychological and neuropsychological assessments of asylum seekers and has written guidelines on this subject, including contributions to the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights guidelines for examining torture and the Physicians for Human Rights handbook on assessing asylum seekers. Both a clinical neuropsychologist and a psychotherapist, Dr. Jacobs has served as an Adjunct Faculty at the Wright Institute, Berkeley since 1997.
